TARGET PRELIMINARY DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Dick Carlisle, Frelich, Leitner and Carlisle, and Rick Howell, Gould Evans Goodman Associates, spoke on behalf of the Seth Child Commons Development, which will include a Target store. The consultants talked about the layout of the development, traffic, drainage, landscape, and Shuss Road.

The Board asked questions about the development in relationship to the Military Trail and future parking lot, drainage, height of the building, future of Shuss Road, access to the Military Trail, and screening the development.

The Board's questions were answered. No action was needed on the development.

Mr. Frank Gibbs, Park Planner, discussed what has been accomplished at the Northeast Park to date and what is planned for the future.

OVERVIEW OF PARK LAND
